MUSIC

Your music should be sent to <u>nzifsamusic@gmail.com</u> in mp3 format by <u>10pm Friday 16 October (note</u> the small extension to the deadline for this). Files should be labelled with the following information:

- Competitor's (or Team's) Name
- Championship Section (e.g. Junior Ladies)
- Program Identification (e.g. Short Program)
- Exact running time of music (not skating time)

ON-ICE OPENING CEREMONY

All competitors are encouraged to take part in the opening ceremony. The opening ceremony will be held on Saturday 24 October. Skaters need to assemble in the foyer area by 2.45pm with their skates on. Please wear your Club uniform. Skaters who have been selected to represent New Zealand at international competitions or Australian Figure Skating Championships may choose to wear their official New Zealand representative jacket if they have one.

Skaters will be asked to line up behind the person holding the sign with their club name on it. Each club will be led onto the ice, skate half a lap, then line up facing the audience. DISC skaters, as the host club, go first, followed by all the other clubs in alphabetic order.

During the Opening Ceremony, the International A and International B Team representatives will be announced and asked to move to the front. Those skaters and teams who competed at the Australian Figure Skating Championships will be named and will be asked to step to the right of their line. This year we will not ask the skaters and teams who competed at the Australian Figure Skating Championships to move to the front.

BANQUET

Shake out your tartan! The banquet will be held on the evening of Tuesday 27 October at the Metro Direct Lounge in the Edgar Centre. The Banquet has an early start for those who might be heading home in the evening. Family members welcome.

Banquet tickets need to be purchased in advance, both for catering numbers and for COVID safety/track and trace reasons. You will be able to collect your pre-purchased tickets at the rink during the competition.

PERMISSION FOR LIVE STREAMING

NZIFSA are aiming to live stream the 2020 New Zealand Ice Figure Skating Championships. Access to the livestream will be via a daily link rather than an open public forum. The daily links will be emailed to all championship participants.

Please temper your expectations around what we are able to offer in terms of live stream. Keep in mind that we cannot match what is on offer by the ISU. The live stream will not be commentated. We will have a separate camera for the live streaming than the one that is used for the judging system. We do not offer any guarantees around the skill level of the camera operators we co-opt to help with this.

Before live streaming any skater we need the explicit permission of the skater, or of their parent/guardian if they are under 18. Please complete the online registration form by <u>Thursday 22</u> <u>October.</u>

VIDEO PERMIT FORM

Spectators must apply in writing to use video equipment to record portions of the event for their private use only. You will need to complete a video permit form if you wish to video any skater. If you wish to video other skaters/teams, you will need the written permission of the skaters concerned, or in the case of minors, their parents/guardians. Please complete and present the attached form to the registration desk on arrival at the rink or pick up a form at the registration desk.

Note, the current plan is for an anti-doping seminar to be held via a zoom meeting at a later date. However, NZIFSA are looking at whether there is an opportunity for a presentation at Nationals.

A REMINDER ABOUT THE SPORTS ANTI-DOPING RULES

Preeya Laud, the NZIFSA Anti-Doping Officer wrote a piece in the July NZIFSA newsletter – the critical messages are reproduced below.

- Remember to please CHECK ALL YOUR MEDICATIONS. Neglecting to do so may result in a 4-year ban from all sport not just figure skating.
- You and only you are responsible for what is put into your body; this includes MEDICATIONS and/or SUPPLEMENTS that you may be taking in or out of season. Supplements pose a risk of producing a positive test due to the unregulated way they are made and tested.
- Drug tests can be carried out in all age groups and levels.
- If you are unsure of whether or not you are allowed to take your medications, please contact Preeya directly through <u>anti-doping@nzifsa.org.nz</u> or you can check out the DFSNZ website where you can check your medications <u>https://drugfreesport.org.nz/medication-check</u>
- The prohibited list can be found through the World Anti-Doping website https://www.wada-ama.org/en/content/what-isprohibited
- If you are sick or injured or need regular treatment for a condition and the medication is Prohibited, you'll need to apply for a Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE). If you think you need a TUE please contact Preeya as soon as possible at <u>anti-doping@nzifsa.org.nz</u>.
