Interclub Competition, Dunedin, New Zealand

This interclub competition doubles as the Dunedin Ice Skating Club Championships 2024, therefore it counts as a club championship for the purposes of NZIFSA Rule 205 (Qualification for Entry to NZ Nationals).

Ice Dimensions	60 metres x 30 metres
Technical Requirements and Eligibility	As per current NZIFSA Rules & Regulations for 2024 NZIFSA: Rules & Regulations (200 and 600 sections). Requirements for Learn to Skate are: Level 1: Forward two-foot sculling (distance equivalent to twice the skater's height) Backward two-foot sculling (distance equivalent to twice the skater's height) One foot snowplough stop Level 2: Across the width of the rink, forward stroking, two foot turn to backwards at the one third mark, backward skating then two foot turn to forwards at the two-thirds mark, then forward stroking towards the long barrier, performing a stop at the boards. Forward crossovers around the hockey circles in a figure 8 pattern. One complete figure 8 pattern to be skated. Level 3: Forward outside edges across the width of the rink Forward inside edges across the width of the rink Forward outside three turns (both directions) RFI – LBI Mohawk and LFI – RBI Mohawk turns
Other Requirements	At close of entries, all New Zealand competitors must be current members of a club affiliated to the NZIFSA and be TC Registered if competing in Pre Elementary and above. Overseas entrants must be current members of a club affiliated to an ISU Member.
Results	The IJS (ISU Judging System) will be used for all IJS Divisions. Results displayed or announced will remain provisional until the results are certified by the segments Referee and Technical Controller.
Event Officials	Referees, Judges, Technical Controllers, Technical Specialists, Data Operators & Video Replay Operators will be nominated by the organizing committee in conjunction with the NZIFSA Officials' Director and chosen from the approved NZIFSA list of officials for 2024.

LATE ENTRIES & REFUNDS

AWARDS

Medals will be awarded to 1st, 2nd and 3rd place skaters. Medals and DISC trophies will also be awarded to the top 3 Dunedin Ice Skating Club skaters in recognition of the Dunedin Ice Skating Club Championships The Corinne Gilkison Cup will be inscribed with the names and clubs of the winners of all Junior and Senior grades. The Cup will reside with the Dunedin Ice Skating Club.

This competition is sanctioned by the NZIFSA.

The IJS (ISU Judging System) will be used for all grades except Learn to Skate/Development which will be determined by majority opinion of the judging panel.
