WHAT IS AN INTERCLUB COMPETITION AND WHO CAN ENTER?

A reminder that skaters can compete in Interclub competitions overseas without needing to be selected as an International Representative. Skaters represent their Club not NZL at these Interclub competitions. To be classified as an Interclub competition they need to meet the ISU's criteria for this type of event. It's not always easy to see which overseas club competitions might meet these criteria, so please do ask us and we will seek confirmation.

If you have skaters that wish to attend interclub competitions, they must have permission from NZIFSA before entering. Please direct them to request permission by emailing <u>secretary@nzifsa.org.nz</u> and specifying which competition and which grade they wish to compete in.

SELECTION POLICY - SHORT SURVEY

A huge thank you to all those that took part in the survey the Board initiated to try and establish the level of support around potential changes to the NZIFSA Selection Policy. To be able to have the Selection Policy in place by 1 July the timeframe for survey responses was unfortunately shorter than ideal. This was largely because of the challenges and therefore time required to craft a survey that would delve into the questions we needed answers to in as simple a manner as possible. While we appreciate some respondents would have liked to have open ended questions so they could explain their stance, getting meaningful information out of that type of survey is quite complicated and time-consuming.

What the survey did give the Board some sense of was whether the concerns and calls for change expressed on the member forums were representative of the views held by the majority of our skating community or not. We received 50 responses and provide a summary of these below.

NOMINATIONS FOR ADMINISTRATOR OF THE YEAR AND SPORTSPERSON OF THE YEAR AWARDS ARE DUE BY 1 SEPTEMBER

An email was sent to clubs earlier this month regarding these awards. We encourage clubs and individual members to nominate the person who you think is the most outstanding volunteer administrator and the skater who displays the attributes of a great sportsperson for the NZIFSA Administrator of the Year Award and the Sportsperson of the Year Award respectively.

Nominations must be received by the General Secretary <u>secretary@nzifsa.org.nz</u> by **1 September.** The Board will be the selectors for this award and will announce the recipients at the social function at the end of the 2023 New Zealand Ice Figure Skating Championships.

Criteria for the Administrator of the Year Award

- Take on a leadership or integral role in their club / sub-association
- Take on administrative/organisational roles and perform their duties in a manner that progresses the sport or enhances the functioning of the club / sub-association
- Positive role model for other administrators of our sport
- Possibly work in a mentoring role within the club / sub-association

Criteria for Nomination for Sportsperson of the Year Award

- Positive role model for other skaters
- Demonstrate a 'fair play' attitude/good sportspersonship
- Positive and tangible contribution to their club and the sport in general

• Active role in the activities offered by the club and/or skate school, e.g. club nights, fundraising, KiwiSkate coaching sessions, etc.

NOTE: While skating achievement is considered, it is not the basis of this award

SITUATIONS <u>STILL</u> VACANT – IJS TECHNICAN

We are very fortunate to have two very dedicated people that have been absolutely critical to us being able to use the two computer systems we use for competitions. Alan Greenstreet, who currently manages the South Island system has, however, signalled that it is time he moved on. Job Description - IJS Technician

The IJS Technician is responsible for the maintenance, setup, troubleshooting and teardown of the International Skating Union (ISU) <u>International Judging System (IJS)</u>. The IJS system comprises the following equipment:

- 1 Network Switch
- 3 Tech Panel computers and an external screen
- 5 Judge tablets
- 1 Camera and video converter
- 1 Shared party-line headset system / headsets
- All the cables to connect everything together.

The role can be broken down into two main parts:

- Computer and equipment maintenance done prior to the start of, and throughout, the competition season
 - Windows OS and driver updates
 - ISU IJS software updates
 - Network configuration maintenance
 - General computer and equipment maintenance checks best achieved by setting the system up and carrying out a test run.
- IJS setup, troubleshooting and teardown for each competition or training session
 - Travel to the competition
 - Layout and cabling of the IJS system
 - Testing the system is functioning correctly
 - \circ Monitoring the system throughout the competition and troubleshooting as required
 - Teardown/packup of the system at the end of each day

Additional role

In addition to the IJS Technician role, there is a desire to have competitions live streamed on the internet. This requires the scheduling of the competition in YouTube studio (or similar platform) and the setup & monitoring of a separate live streaming computer / camera system.

Skills / Experience

These roles would suit someone with a good computer systems background that involves the configuration and setup of hardware as well as software. Industry roles might be someone who works in IS Helpdesk, Network Admin, Software / Hardware development, or Radio/Film/TV/Theatre.

Anyone with a job, hobby or strong interest in computer systems would find this a rewarding role and one that helps support the NZ figure skating community.
