PERMISSION TO ATTEND COMPETITIONS OUTSIDE NEW ZEALAND

OCEANIA INTERNATIONAL COMPETITION AND COACHES SEMINAR, MELBOURNE AUSTRALIA, 26-30 MAY 2025

The 2025 Oceania International Figure Skating Competition is being at the O'Brien Icehouse in Melbourne, Australia 26-28 May. This competition is jointly hosted by Ice Skating Australia and NZIFSA and is a great opportunity for our international representative Singles skaters to take part in an International Competition, without having to travel half way round the world. The competition will include Basic Novice to Senior grades. The competition will be followed by a coach development seminar 29-30 May. We will have an announcement and more details about the competition and coach development seminar very soon. In the meantime, International Representative A & B Team skaters, can you please submit confirmation of interest by **24 February** if you are planning to take part in this competition. Note, you can only compete in the grade(s) you were selected to at the 2024 National Championships.

We will have a Team Leader and an Assistant Team Leader for this event meaning skaters will be appropriately supervised if attending without a parent.

CALL FOR TEAM LEADERS FOR OCEANIA INTERNATIONAL COMPETITION MELBOURNE AUSTRALIA, 26-28 MAY 2025

We are seeking expressions of interest from people who would like to be considered for the Team Leader role for the Oceania International Figure Skating Competition, Melbourne, Australia 26 – 28 May. Given the number of skaters we anticipate will attend this competition NZIFSA will also be appointing an Assistant Team Leader to share the workload and responsibilities.

Please submit your expression of interest by **12 noon on Monday 3 March** via the online link below.

We are looking for a Team Leader who has enough experience of international competitions, ideally either as an official or coach, to be able to coordinate the activities of our team members. As outlined in the position description, they need to be able to handle crisis situations as well as routine administrative tasks; be team players who can work with all athletes, coaches, judges, parents, and administrators; have knowledge of the NZIFSA rules and agreements surrounding international participation; and, have local knowledge that well assist them in carrying out their role.

The Assistant Team Leader role is an ideal opportunity for someone who meets the criteria above but doesn't yet have that experience with international competitions.

CLUCAS CUP (SELECTION COMPETITION), AUCKLAND 13 & 14 JUNE 2025

In recognition of the contribution made to figure skating this competition is named after our late Patron, Wendy Clucas (nee Grafton).

The Clucas Cup will be awarded to the skater/ couple / or team that gains the highest percentage above the A team Selection TES, with the highest unfactored programme component score as the deciding factor if more than 1 skater is on a par.

As per the NZIFSA Selection Policy, this competition is to determine selection and priority order for international competitions with a closing date between 7 July 2025 and one week after our

National Championships. The competition will be open to skaters in Basic Novice to Senior grades in all disciplines, plus Mixed Age Synchronized skating, who competed at the 2024 National Championships and who are age eligible for international competition in their respective grade as at 1 July 2025. CONFIRMATION OF DATES AND LOCATION FOR 2025 NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

UPCOMING SKATER DEVELOPMENT ACTIVITIES

Ice Dance & Synchro Upskilling - Auckland (Botany), 1-2 March and Dunedin, 14-16 March

Moderators: Multiple ISU Coach Scholarship recipients Debbie Darvill & Tracy Hipkiss.

Skaters from all disciplines are encouraged to attend. While these camps serve as an introduction to ice dance and synchro, the focus will be on skating skills development, using techniques from these disciplines to strengthen power, edge quality and control, timing, musicality and creativity.

These workshops are recommended to coaches, particularly those needing an introduction to these disciplines as they work towards Level 2, or those with an interest in expanding their repertoire. The workshops are fully eligible for maintaining points.

Test requirement: Minimum of Elementary (Test 0) Stroking or Ice Dance

Target audience: Pre – Elementary to Basic Novice & Adults and Youth Interpretive.

Singles Basic Novice to Senior - Auckland (Botany), 18-21 April

We are very pleased to confirm **Kevin Reynolds** and **Alaine Chartrand** as the international moderators for this workshop. Kevin represented Canada on the international stage with extensive experience. His achievements include winning a team silver medal at the 2014 Winter Olympics, becoming the 2013 Four Continents Champion, and making history as the first skater to successfully land two quadruple jumps in a short program. Alaine also represented Canada on the international stage, earning a bronze medal at the 2014 Rostelecom Cup, a silver medal at the 2016 CS Autumn Classic, and claiming the title of Canadian national champion twice.

We anticipate the camp will include all day workshops from 18 to 21 April. In addition to the onice sessions, we plan to include standard off-ice, dance, and workshops on nutrition and antidoping. An online or in person media training session may also be offered in conjunction with this camp.

Skaters coming from outside Auckland should plan to stay in Auckland on the Thursday night before the camp starts.

Skaters will be divided into two groups, with different programmes designed to best meet their needs. Skaters may be moved between groups at the discretion of the moderators.

Information regarding these courses was communicated via rinks, clubs and coaches.

Registrations for the KiwiSkate and Level 1 Coaching Courses closed **11am on Sunday 2 February**.

<u>KiwiSkate Coaching Course - Alpine Ice, Christchurch, 15-16 February</u>

Proposed timing: 2pm Saturday - 1pm Sunday (exact timing TBC).

Course Fee: \$90

The course covers two levels:

KiwiSkate Assistant Course - individuals must be 14 years of age as at 1 January prior to the course and it is recommended they hold an Elementary test in any discipline.

KiwiSkate Coach Course – individuals must be 15 years of age as at 1 January prior to the course and must hold an Elementary test in any discipline. Coaches from different codes may apply to the Coaching Director for test dispensation based on their achievements/qualifications.

Level 1 Coaching Course - Alpine Ice, Christchurch, 15-16 February

Proposed timing:2pm Saturday till 1pm Sunday (exact timing TBC).

Course Fee: \$150

To be eligible to attend the Level 1 course you must:

- be a current NZIFSA KiwiSkate (or Level 1) Coach member, and
- have earned the Coach Education Points required to maintain accreditation at your current level before the course commences *
- be a minimum of 16 years as at 1 January 2025
- hold a minimum of preliminary test in any discipline

Level 2 Coaching Course

Due to the unavailability of a moderator, organizing the Level 2 coaching course has faced challenges. NZIFSA plans to introduce a new course aligned with the ISU framework, set to begin in October/November 2025 (after Nationals), with the on-ice practical section scheduled for January/February 2026. Participants must complete at least six weeks of online sessions before the practical weekend. To support Level 1 coaches that are ready to progress to Level 2, NZIFSA is aiming to appoint Level 3 mentors to guide them throughout the 2025 season, assisting with competitions and tests. Additionally, it has approved a Provisional Level 2 Apprentice dispensation, with applications reviewed on a case-by-case basis. Further information will be provided to current Level 1 Coaches regarding the application process.

SYS Seminar for Judges and Technical Specialists – online session April.

Introductory sessions for new Probationary officials — online session early June. Further information will be announced closer to the time.

Initial Judges Meeting (All Disciplines) – online session late June. This is a preseason meeting. All judges are expected to attend. Further information will be announced closer to the time.

Tech Specialist/Controller Seminar (Singles) - Auckland 10-11 May. With ISU Technical Controller & ISU Technical Specialists Robert Rosenbluth & Steven Hsu, Auckland 10-11 May.

Robert Rosenbluth brings extensive international experience to the technical panel. He has served as a technical controller at numerous international events, including the 2022 and 2023 World Junior Championships. He also judged at the 2024 Senior Grand Prix in Canada and was part of the panel at the 2014 Winter Olympics.

Steven Hsu has been on the international panel since the 2005–2006 season, working as both a technical controller and specialist at various U.S. national competitions. He has also served as a data/replay operator at major events, including the 2024 Grand Prix Final and the 2023 Senior Grand Prix in China.

This is a valuable opportunity to work with two experienced moderators, allowing us to deepen our knowledge and enhance our skills as Tech Specialists and Tech Controllers in New Zealand.
