

- * Skaters are eligible for selection to a grade other than the one they competed in due to age. Their scores have been adjusted as per Appendix B of the Selection Policy to determine priority order.
- *** For a synchronized skating team to retain their selection, 75% of the team going to the international competition must have been listed as part of the team selected at the NZ National Championships and must meet the requirements for that grade for that competition.

AWARDING OF THE CLUCAS CUP

The 2024 Clucas Cup Competition included the presentation of the Clucas Cup, named in memory of Wendy Clucas and presented by her daughters Janine and Sonja. The cup is awarded to the skater that gains the highest percentage above the A team Selection TES, with the highest unfactored programme component score as the deciding factor if there is a draw.

Dwayne Li won the cup again by an impressive margin, having achieved 111% above the required A Team TES for Junior Men.

North Island Ice Skating Sub-Association April Development camp

The North Island Ice Skating Sub-Association recently ran a development camp for NI skaters from the 14-17 April 2024. This was the first camp run since before Covid and much anticipated by all. We were fortunate to have coach and choreographer Anne Goldberg-Baldwin from the Boston Skating Club moderate this camp. Anne is a triple Master Rated coach through the PSA and she has coached and choreographed extensively throughout the US. Anne specialises in spins, performance and choreography blending the technical and artistic aspects of skating and fostering creativity and exploration while maximising point potential for her athletes. The NIISSA camp was open to all levels of competitive skaters and we had a large number of skaters and coaches attending. In total, we had 12 adult skaters, 26 figure skaters and 7 coaches participating over the 4 days of on-ice and off-ice activities. Skaters thoroughly enjoyed the engaging and dynamic coaching technique brought by Anne. MUSIC DETAILS REQUIRED FOR MUSIC LICENSING

In preparation for the 2024 competition season we need everyone to provide or update your music details to help ensure we can meet our music licensing requirements.

For all club and regional competitions in the South Island and for the Clucas Cup and our National Championships, please use the NZIFSA form.

NOTE: The North Island Ice Skating Sub Association (NIISSA) has chosen to manage the music information using a separate system for North Island club and regional competitions that better meets their needs.

What information do you need to provide?

1 General

Skater name(s), email address(s), grade, coach name, coach email address. Please update coach contact details if this has changed.

Note, only one form needs to be completed for ice dance couples and pairs teams. For synchro teams we ask for the team manager and coach contact details.

2 What competitions and grade are you entering?

Please mark which competitions you are entering and pick the correct grade from the drop down menu. This helps the competition organisers when checking that they have your music details. You can come back and update this again later with any additional competitions you enter, or if you move up grades during the year.

3 The music details.

For each programme you skate you will need to provide the following for each piece of music used

- Title of Music
- Recording Artist(s)
- Composer(s)
- Publisher / Record Label
- Duration of cut (min:sec e.g. 1:40)
- Whether vocal or non-vocal (instrumental)

We suggest you collect this information for each piece music before you start filling in the form. If you are trying to find the details, we recommend you find your piece of music in Spotify, click on the 3 dots ... for extra information and choose "Show credits".

Saving and updating the form

You need to click the save button at the bottom right of the form before you exit. The skater and coach will both be sent an email called "2024 Music details Save & Resume Link". With this link you will be able to go back and update details, including entry to additional competitions or changes to the music details recorded.

Separate forms for different events

If a skater is competing more than one event, e.g. Dance and Singles, or Interpretive and Singles, then separate forms need to be completed. This is so that we can check that we have the required music details for any given competition. But if you compete in an event that has more than one part to it – e.g a Short Programme and a Freeskate, you can enter this information in the one form.

Skaters, can you all please make sure you have an up-to-date portrait style photo loaded onto the NZIFSA website. We need a passport style photo (except you are allowed to smile) rather than an action photo. We use these photos for competition programmes and for the newsletter. Often we find they are four of five years out of date and we may have a skater aged fifteen with a photo of them at age ten. TEAM LEADERS FOR INTERNATIONAL COMPETITIONS

The NZIFSA are seeking expressions of interest from suitably experienced individuals to fulfil the Team Leader role at the following international events:

- Junior Grand Prix Bangkok, Thailand, 11-14 September
- Junior Grand Prix Wuxi, China, 9-12 October

For all events with 2 or more skaters a skater's coach or parent will not normally be named as Team Leader.

We are looking for team leaders who have enough experience of international competitions, ideally either as an official or coach, to be able to coordinate the activities of our team members. As outlined in the position description, they need to be able to handle crisis situations as well as routine administrative tasks; be team players who can work with all athletes, coaches, judges, parents, and administrators; have knowledge of the NZIFSA rules and agreements surrounding international participation; and, have local knowledge that well assist them in carrying out their role.

The NZIFSA Funding Policy https://nzifsa.org.nz/rules/Funding%20Policy%20%20V11.pdf section 10, outlines two different maximum funding criteria based on the location of each ISU Championship or International as indicated below:

- For events in North/South America, Asia and Oceania, \$1,650 plus cost of official accommodation if not provided by ISU for official days of competition
- For events in Europe and South Africa, \$2,750 plus cost of official accommodation if not provided by ISU for official days of competition

Normally a person may be selected for a team leader position only once per funding season, however if circumstances require an individual to serve as team leader at more than one competition, funding will be provided in all cases.

CHANGES TO NATIONALS' QUALIFICATION TES

Following the recent ISU Congress hosted in Las Vegas USA, a number of the proposed changes to the technical requirements that had been advised in ISU Communications 2624 and 2623 do not come into effect this season. The Nationals qualifying TES for Junior and Senior grades have been recalculated to reflect the ISU Congress decision to delay the proposed changes to these grades that would have seen a reduction in the maximum number of jumps from seven to six and a change to the spin requirements that included the introduction of a choreographic spin. The Junior and Senior TES included in the original announcement for Nationals were based on the assumption that proposed changes to the technical requirements would be adopted at the 2024 ISU Congress and come into effect 1 July.

In addition to the above, the qualifying TES for adult Silver and Elite Freeskate has also been updated in response to recently announced changes in the requirements for these grades. The maximum number of jumps allowed in each of these grades has been reduced by one, and the qualifying TES has been adjusted accordingly.
