What an incredible milestone for New Zealand at the 2025 World Junior Figure Skating Championships! This year's competition has been historic for NZ, marking the first time New Zealand has been represented by both a Junior Men's and Junior Women's skater at the same event. Dwayne's 10th place finish granted NZ 2 spots for Junior Men at the next Junior Worlds, also a first for NZ. Not only is this a testament to the growing talent and dedication within New Zealand's figure skating community, but it also highlights the country's increasing presence in the sport.

The competition itself was fiercely competitive, with over 40 skaters in each of the singles disciplines, showcasing the depth of talent from around the world. For New Zealand to have two skaters qualify and compete at this level is a remarkable achievement, reflecting the hard work of the athletes and coaches.

This milestone is a significant step forward for figure skating in New Zealand, inspiring a new generation of skaters to dream big and aim for international competitions. The success at the 2025 World Junior Championships is a clear indication that New Zealand is placing their mark in the sport of skating.

BARBARA LINDSAY TAYLOR – RETIRING SENIOR REFEREE, JUDGE & TECHNICAL CONTROLLER

A Tribute to Barbara

Barbara Lindsay Taylor has been a dedicated figure skating official for over 50 years, making a significant impact on the sport in New Zealand.



Her journey in figure skating began in Christchurch in the mid-1960s, where she passed both her Prelim Figure and Bronze Figure tests in 1965. That same year, she competed in the Intermediate Ladies category at the New Zealand Championships in Arrowtown—a time when the sport had only three competitive grades: Junior, Intermediate, and Senior.

After relocating to Auckland, Barbara continued skating at the Glen Innes rink, which opened in 1972. Her judging career started even earlier, in the early 1970s, first in roller skating and then in ice figure skating from 1974. She was mentored by Graeme Shepherd, a respected Senior NZIFSA Judge and International Roller-Skating Judge.

Throughout her career, Barbara has judged countless figure skating tests, mentored new judges and officials, and officiated at club, regional, and national events across the country. In earlier years, when financial support from the national body was limited, officials often covered their own travel expenses—a stark contrast to today's arrangements.

Beyond her officiating roles, Barbara has also contributed significantly to the administration of the sport. She served for many years on the Auckland branch of the NZISA Technical Committee, was a member of the NZIFSA Board from 2012 to 2013, and held the position of Vice President from 2014 to 2017. She was honoured with Life Membership of NZIFSA in 2006.

Barbara's leadership extended internationally as well, serving as Team Leader for the Four Continents Championships in South Korea in 2005 and the Australian Youth Olympic Festival in 2007.

In recognition of her longstanding service and dedication, Barbara was appointed Patron of the NZIFSA in 2023.

Her contributions to figure skating in New Zealand have left a lasting legacy, and she will be greatly missed in her officiating roles. We extend our deepest gratitude and best wishes for her wellearned retirement.

OCEANIA INTERNATIONAL COMPETITION AND COACHES SEMINAR, MELBOURNE AUSTRALIA, 26-28 MAY 2025

CLUCAS CUP (SELECTION COMPETITION), AUCKLAND 13 & 14 JUNE 2025

In recognition of the contribution made to figure skating this competition is named after our late Patron, Wendy Clucas (nee Grafton).

The Clucas Cup will be awarded to the skater/ couple / or team that gains the highest percentage above the A team Selection TES, with the highest unfactored programme component score as the deciding factor if more than 1 skater is on a par.

As per the NZIFSA Selection Policy, this competition is to determine selection and priority order for international competitions with a closing date between 7 July 2025 and one week after our National Championships. The competition will be open to skaters in Basic Novice to Senior grades in all disciplines, plus Mixed Age Synchronized skating, who competed at the 2024 National Championships and who are age eligible for international competition in their respective grade as at 1 July 2025. A & B Team Technical Feedback Session, Auckland (Botany), 9 May

This year, in conjunction with our officials' training, NZIFSA will be offering a technical feedback session for our A and B Team skaters with international technical panelists. We are very fortunate to have ISU Referee & Technical Controller Rob Rosenbluth and ISU Judge/International Technical Controller Steven Hsu (both from USA) sharing their expertise with us.

The skaters' session is focused on steps and spins, and is an opportunity to gain feedback on these elements of programs ahead of the season.

The schedule is modelled on similar sessions run overseas, and will be in two parts: A Team followed by B Team. All attendees from each team will be on the ice during their session. Coaches may observe from off the ice. Elements will be performed in isolation and our technical panelists will provide feedback for each skater. There will be space for skaters and coaches to ask questions.

Time: Friday 9 May, 7:15-9:45 am (approx.)

Cost: \$75 per skater; Level 2-4 coaches free.

Registration details will be sent to all A & B Team skaters soon, so please keep an eye out. The registration period will be relatively short so that we can plan effectively with our moderators.

Technical Rules Session (for everyone), Auckland/Zoom, 9 May

We are also looking at including a free technical rules session on the afternoon of the same day as the feedback sessions above. This rules session will be open to all but will likely focus on information for novice grades and above.

He has also served as a data/replay operator at major events, including the 2024 Grand Prix Final and the 2023 Senior Grand Prix in China.

TEAM LEADER EXPRESSIONS OF INTEREST FOR THAILAND OPEN

The NZIFSA are seeking expressions of interest from suitably experienced individuals to fulfil the Team Leader role at the **Thailand Open Figure Skating Trophy – Bangkok, Thailand, 2-6 May 2025.**

The ideal candidate should be capable of managing both high-pressure situations and routine administrative tasks. As outlined in the position description, the Team Leader must be a team player who can collaborate effectively with athletes, coaches, judges, parents, and administrators.

They should have a solid understanding of NZIFSA rules and the protocols for international events, as well as possess local knowledge to facilitate smooth coordination during the competition. A proven track record in international events is essential, as we aim to ensure that our skaters have the best possible support in achieving their goals on the world stage

The NZIFSA Funding Policy https://nzifsa.org.nz/rules/Funding%20Policy%20%20V11.pdf section 10, outlines two different maximum funding criteria based on the location of each ISU Championship or International. For the Thailand Open funding will be "For events in North/South America, Asia and Oceania, \$1,650 plus cost of official accommodation if not provided by ISU for official days of competition

Normally a person may be selected for a team leader position only once per funding season, however if circumstances require an individual to serve as team leader at more than one competition, funding will be provided in all cases.
